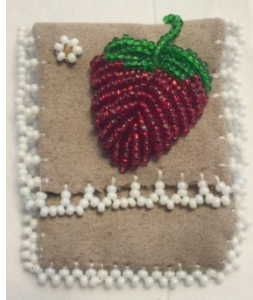


Raised Beadwork: On the Fringe Workshops

Beaded Medicine Bag

Participants will make a small medicine bag that can also be finished as a necklace. The bag is approximately 1 ½ inches. The bag with a raised beaded strawberry is made of glass beads and fabric. Basic supplies are included in the class fee. This workshop is appropriate for beginners. Maximum class size is 20.
