Enrollment is limited and requires this application. Only 4-8 adult apprentices will be in the program, based on skill level. These courses are designed for community artists who have experience in silver jewelry making and interested in honing their with the guidance of master artists. Applications will be reviewed by staff and local artists in this art form. Selection process will be based upon commitment, experience, and desired outcome. If you are unable to carry out the terms listed below, considerations may be altered.

Participation in the program is contingent on being able to do the following: 1. Attend all master artist classes without exception (see schedule). 2. Work outside of class time to finish projects. 3. Must be willing to teach and/or sell your work. 4. Attend at least one business class (schedule to be determined). 5. Fill in and return reflection journal (after program completion). 6. Show your work in a display/show (schedule to be determined this fall, art pieces will be on display for up to one year) 7. Optional Participate in the Woodland Indian Art Show (May 24-26, 2019).
